Candice and her team of nursery volunteers are busy making preparations for the annual Spring Plant Sale, a major fundraiser for the garden. You won't want to miss this opportunity to purchase interesting, hard to find plants at discount prices. Be sure to put April 24 and 25 on your calendar.

This vear's Oceanside Rhododendron Festival, May 15 & 16, will celebrate the Garden's Rhododendron collection with the launch of our new booklet entitled The Rhododendrons of Milner Gardens and Woodland. Kristi Ozero and Keith Leinweber have designed and produced this wonderful full colour booklet that tells the story of the genus Rhododendron and explains how our collection came to be. The festival includes regularly scheduled tours of the Rhododendron grove, a truss show of Rhododendrons from the garden and a showing of paintings and watercolours by local artists.

Also, the Rhododendron Festival will see the first ever Canadian participation in the Garden Conservancy Open Days Program. Visit one or twelve of B. C.'s best gardens in this prestigious event on May 15,16 and 18. Your participation will help support the work of the Garden Conservancy as well as the preservation of the Arthur Erickson House and Garden in Vancouver, the Abkhazi Garden in Victoria and here at the Milner Gardens and Woodland. more (see information on p. 7)

The Volunteer Support Group is a new

feature at the garden. This group has been formed for the enrichment and enhancement of volunteer activities. Many new initiatives for volunteers such as guest speakers and off-site bus tours will come from this group.

Some staff changes are taking place this spring. Candice Coghill has decided to focus on plant production and sales and has stepped down as Children's Program Coordinator. Candice's efforts in the development and first offering of the *Roots and Shoots Intergenerational Gardening Program* have created a good foundation for its continuation and growth.

Our new Children's Program Coordinator is former Roots and Shoots mentor, Charlene Forrest. Charlene holds a BSc-Biology from the University of Northern B.C. and is about to undergo her MSc-Botany defense. We are very excited to welcome Charlene to the MGW team. The Children's Coordinator position is made possible by a Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust grant and \$20,000 donation from Windsor Plywood. This support enables us to plan, develop and further implement the Milner Gardens Children's Program in this community.

Charlene's background and training in forest ecology and her interest in developing activities for children in the forest parallel our current initiative to construct a Welcome and Interpretive Centre and to develop the second phase of the popular Forest Interpretive Trail. Featured Plant Eucryphia

Spring, one of the busiest times of the year for us down in the garden (mark my word, I'll say this again come next newsletter!). So busy that I often forget to look up and see everything that's in bloom around me, too busy planning for the Nursery.

If you have the opportunity to visit the gardens please do. It's a beautiful time of year with the Magnolia buds bursting open, the orchard with a light pink dusting of blossoms, the forgetme-nots, the primulas, the lungwart and the epimediums, the native pink fawn lily and the euphorbias, tulips,

and daffodils, and the many rhododendrons in bloom and soon to be in bloom and so much more. Take a moment to walk the gardens and just breathe. No hustle, no emails, no faxes, no phone calls, and no meetings. Just you, the garden, the bees, the birdsong and the oceans gentle lapping.

There will be another day for all those other things, I promise. Right now it's a great time of the year to stop and look up!

The garden is fortunate enough to be graced with several of these evergreen trees. The Eucryphia is an upright, evergreen woodland tree that is native to Chile and S.E. Australia. It prefers to have its roots shaded and top in the sun. At a maximum height of 10m (*Eucryphia x intermedia 'Rostrevor'*) and 15m (Eucryphia x nymansensis 'Nymansay') they make a bold addition to any

garden. They are narrower than they are tall making them columnar in shape and manageable in a smaller garden. The dark green glossy leaves are attractive any time of the year but it is the flowering time that makes this tree a welcome addition to the garden. Beginning in August these trees bear beautiful cupped shaped white flowers between 6 and 8 cm across. They are from Zones 9-10 and do well to be protected from severe cold.
